It doesn't take long for Patrick to completely immerse himself in it.















BREAKDOWN

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

In 2012 we created a short sci-fi film titled SIGHT, the film became a huge success, sparking countless discussions, lerctures and even taught in some university courses.

Eight years later, it seems that the themes in SIGHT are more relevant than ever, especially now in the post Covid-19 era, where people have been forced to work from home and communicate digitally through remote classrooms and virtual meetings, perhaps for the foreseeable future. An oxymoron emerges from this situation that fascinates us — the ability to so easily connect with a wider audience, while at the same time distancing ourselves from them. Does this technology bring us closer together or does it pull us apart? Does it make us more knowledgeable with its infinite access to information or does it make us more susceptible to fake news and manipulations?

It is evident that technology is marching forward at an ever increasing pace. Augmented reality and virtual reality are now household names, with a market worth billions of dollars. We are not far now from the days when our smartphone screens will cover our own eyeballs, and artificial intelligence will govern our lives even more comprehensively than it already does now. To us, this future is very polarizing. While some can't wait to attain these augmented superpowers, others live in fear of a future in which we transform into sedated mice running on a giant wheel. As filmmakers, we want to show it all — the good, the bad, and the provocative.
